Here's what we require from you:

1. 75 to 100 word abstract that describes your talk. For ideas, look at past "APICS Update's" (the Chapter's monthly newsletter) or check out our website at www.apicstc.org.
2. Three learning objectives that attendees will leave with; for example, "how to ...," list and explain...," "identify ..." (an "understanding of" is not an objective).
3. 75 to 100 word bio that describes your background and experiences.
4. Presentation or seminar title.
5. Two references (names and contact information) who have heard this presentation before or have had the opportunity to hear you deliver presentations in the past two (2) years.
6. Your full contact information (including e-mail address).

All of the above on a single page, please!

If selected to present at an APICS event, we will also need a low resolution (300 dpi) digital photograph of you AND a copy of the presentation—as you plan to deliver it—two (2) weeks prior to the engagement. No exceptions!

Topic Guidelines

We like topics that cover both 'hard' and 'soft' skills that are highly relevant to those working in manufacturing operations, supply chain management, and inventory management. We look for a good mix of topics that contribute to professional and personal growth. ***This is NOT an opportunity to promote your products or services.*** We are open to case studies, panel discussions, pre-dinner meetings, roundtables, and standard lecture formats.
